





About the Houston Symphony

Founded in 1913, the Houston Symphony is one of America's oldest performing arts organizations, with a distinguished musical history. Over the years, the orchestra has grown and matured under the direction of distinguished leaders such as Ernst Hoffman (1936-47), Efrem Kurtz (1948-54), Ferenc Fricsay (1954), Leopold Stokowski (1955-61), Sir John Barbirolli (1961-67), Andre Previn (1967-69), Lawrence Foster (1971-78), Sergiu Comissiona (1979-88) and Christoph Eschenbach (1988-99). Maestro Hans Graf, who took the podium in September 2001, is the Houston Symphony's

fifteenth music director. The orchestra came of age in the 1940s, when Maestros Hoffman and Kurtz began hiring highly talented professional musicians, many of whom remained with the orchestra for more than 30 years. Leopold Stokowski brought the Symphony international recognition by commissioning new works and making recordings, and, in Sir John Barbirolli's years, the Houston Symphony flowered under the influence of his lush romantic style. The orchestra moved into Jones Hall, its current home, in 1966, and in 1971, the Symphony signed its first 52-week contract with

the musicians. Today, the Houston Symphony is widely acclaimed as one of the top orchestras in the world.

The Symphony's Education & Community Programs reach over 40,000 students from various school districts who attend David Dewhurst Symphony Explorer and Macy's Symphony Detective concerts.



How to Care for a Bougainvillea Tree

Bougainvillea is a hardy, versatile tropical plant that produces masses of colorful blooms in the hot summer months. Bougainvillea trees are used as landscape accent plants that easily grow to 40 feet in height and width. Compact and dwarf varieties reach 2 to 3 feet tall and are used as container plants and ground cover. It is frost sensitive and hardy to U.S. Department of Agriculture planting zones 9 to 11. Bougainvillea trees are grown indoors in cooler climates. Several steps can be taken to ensure an abundantly blooming bougainvillea.

- The bougainvillea originates from the hot arid coast of Brazil and thrive in very bright, full sunlight. If your bougainvillea plant is not receiving enough light, its leaves will begin to fall and flowering will be sparse. Select a site that receives six to eight hours of direct sun per day. Bougainvilleas bloom best when they receive light all day.

- Plant bougainvilleas in 5-gallon-size containers. Restricting the root system encourages blooming. Bougainvilleas planted in the ground spread rapidly. Container-grown bougainvilleas produce flowers the first and second years.

- Fill half of the container with a mix of equal parts compost and garden soil. Spread the bougainvillea tree roots over the mixture while holding the trunk

straight. Fill the remaining container space with soil, tamping it down firmly around the roots. Soak with water until the top 1 inch of soil is moist but not soggy.

- Because bougainvillea vines are fast growing, they require regular, almost constant feeding. Feeding your vine a half-strength, water-soluble fertilizer, like Miracle Gro or a specialty hibiscus fertilizer, will keep your bougainvillea blooming longer. Fertilize monthly with organic compost fertilizer. Apply 1 cup or follow the package directions for commercial products.

- Many gardeners think the bougainvillea requires lots of water, but this is not true. Bougainvillea does like to live in lightly moist soil, but if you allow the soil to be slightly on the dry side, stressing the plant, your bougainvillea will bloom better. Water when the soil surface is dry to the touch. Keep the soil moist but not wet. Leaves and flowers wilt slightly when water is needed.

- Re-pot the tree when the root system is tightly crowded in the container. Plant in a new container that is 2 inches wider and deeper than the existing pot. The bougainvillea plant will continue to bloom abundantly when its root system has only a small amount of growing room

Pruning your Bougainvillea


Bougainvillea trees can be trimmed and trained to take on any shape or size. They can be pruned any time of the year. However, the best time to prune them is during the springtime, after a flush of bloom, or to remove any frost damage.

- Prune the tree after a bloom period. Cut off all damaged or broken canes. Top cut 1 foot per year to prevent sprawling. Bougainvillea flowers develop on new branches, and pruning back the old ones encourages blooming. Bougainvilleas can be pruned to remain bushy and low-growing or grown on a structure such as a fence or trellis. Personal preference can dictate pruning style with this flexible plant.

- Train a young plant by selecting the strongest shoot and pruning all the rest. Alternatively, three shoots can be braided together. In either case, tie the plant to a stake for support. Cut off any new shoots you find on the trunk.

- Use the "soft pinch" prun-

ing method on the bougainvillea tree. Once the trunk has reached the desired height, use your thumb and index finger to pinch off about a 1/2-inch of new growth. This promotes the growth of the head. As the shoots continue to grow, continue the pinching to create fullness. New stems will grow from just below where they were pinched.




- Prune the bougainvillea before moving it indoors for the winter, or to contain growth. This latter technique removes quite a lot of branches so the tree does not extend past its container; this is important to how vigorous the tree is. New growth will start one or more leaf buds below the cut, not up or down the branch. This technique best applies to non-vining bougainvillea vari-

eties. Blossoms like to grow on new wood, and the more you cut them back, the more blossoms you will get.

- New dwarf bougainvillea cultivars grow well in hanging baskets.

- If a container-grown bougainvillea begins to grow rampantly and produce large, dark green leaves, it has received too much fertilizer.

- Bougainvillea roots are delicate and easily snapped off during re-potting.




After apple-pickin'
